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# U. S. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE Forest Service IRRIGATION WATER TRANSMISSION PIPELINE EASEMENT Act of October 21, 1976 (P. L. 94-579); 36 CFR 251.50, et seq

THIS EASEMENT, dated this \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_\_\_, 2001, from the United States of America, acting by and through the Forest Service, Department of Agriculture, hereinafter called Grantor, to Skamania County, a municipal corporation of the State of Washington, hereinafter called Grantee.

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Grantee has applied for a grant of an easement under the Act of October 21, 1976 (90 Stat. 2743; 43 U.S.C. 1761), for an existing underground irrigation water transmission pipeline with above ground risers and attachments for use upon, under, and over certain lands or assignable easements owned by the United States in the County of Skamania, State of Washington, and administered by the Forest Service, Department of Agriculture.

NOW THEREFORE, Grantor does hereby grant to Grantee, subject to existing easements and valid rights, a nonexclusive easement for the purpose described above, upon, under, and over and across the following described lands in the County of Skamania State of Washington.

T. 4 N. R. 7 E., W.M., sec. 22, lot 1; sec. 27, lots 5, 8, 11, and 14.

The location of said easement is more specifically described on Exhibits B-1 through B-9, attached hereto and made a part hereof.

This grant is made subject to the following terms, provisions, and conditions applicable to Grantee, its permittees, contractors, assignees, and successors in interest.

A. Grantee shall comply with applicable Federal and/or State law and shall comply with State standards for public health and safety, environmental protection and sitting, construction, operation, and maintenance of or for rights-of-ways for similar purposes, if those standards are more stringent than applicable Federal standards.

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- B. Upon change of ownership of the land or facility served by this easement, the rights granted under this easement can be transferred or assigned to a new owner upon written notification to Regional Forester.
- C. This easement shall continue for as long as the property served is used for the management of the Wind River Nursery; Provided, That the Grantor shall review terms and conditions of this easement at the end of each 30-year period from the date of issuance, and may incorporate in the easement such new terms, conditions, and stipulations as existing or prospective conditions warrant. These shall have the same force and effect as if included in the original grant.
- D. All construction or reconstruction of the authorized facilities shall be in accordance with plans, specifications, and written stipulations approved by the Grantor prior to beginning such construction or reconstruction.
- E. Grantee shall have the right to cut timber upon the easement area to the extent necessary to maintain the authorized facilities. Timber so cut shall, unless otherwise agreed to, be cut into standard log lengths or other products as specified the authorized officer, and decked along the road for disposal by the owner of such timber.
- F. Grantee shall maintain the right-of-way clearing by means of chemicals only after the Grantor has given specific written approval. Application for such approval must be in writing and must specify the time, method, chemicals, and the exact portion of the right-of-way to be chemically treated.
- G. Grantee shall provide maintenance so that there is no damage on adjacent National Forest Land. Grantee shall construct and maintain lead-off drainage and water barriers as necessary to prevent erosion.
- H. Grantee shall pay the United States for all injury, loss, or damage, including fire suppression costs, suffered by the United States in accordance with existing Federal and State laws.
- Grantee shall indemnify the United States for any and all injury, loss, or damage, including fire suppression costs the United States may suffer as a result of claims, demands, losses, or judgments caused by the Grantee's use or occupancy under this easement.
- J. Upon termination of this easement, Grantee shall remove within a reasonable time the structures and improvements and shall restore the site to a condition satisfactory to the Grantor, unless otherwise waived in writing. If the Grantee

fails to remove the structures or improvements within a reasonable period, as determined by the Grantor, the Grantor may remove and dispose of any improvements and restore the area, and all costs shall be paid by the Grantee.

If the Grantor waives the removal of the improvements and restoration of the site, all improvements shall become the property of the United States.

This easement is granted subject to the following reservations by Grantor for itself, its permittees, contractors, and assignees:

- The right to cross and recross the authorized right-of-way at any place by any reasonable means and for any purpose in such manner as will not interfere unreasonably with Grantee's use of the authorized facilities.
- 2. The right to all timber now or hereafter growing on the right-of-way, subject to Grantee's right to cut such timber as herein provided.
- 3. The right to occupy and use, and to issue or grant rights-of-way for land uses other than those authorized by this easement upon, over, under and through the easement area provided that the occupancy and use do not interfere unreasonably with the rights herein granted.
- 4. The right alone to extend rights and privileges for use of the authorized facilities and right-of-way to other Government departments and agencies, States, and local subdivisions thereof, and to other users including members of the public; Provided, That the Grantor shall control such use so as not to interfere unreasonably with use of the facilities by Grantee or to cause Grantee to bear a share of the cost of maintenance greater than is commensurate with the Grantee's use of the easement.

The Regional Forester may take action to suspend, revoke, or terminate this easement under the Rules of Practice Governing Formal Adjudicatory Administrative Proceedings Instituted by the Secretary Under Various Statutes in 7 CFR 1.130-1.151. An administrative proceeding is not required when the easement terminates on the occurrence of a fixed or agreed-upon condition, event, or time.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, Grantor, by its Director of Recreation, Lands, and Mineral Resources, Pacific Northwest Region, Forest Service, has executed this easement pursuant to the delegation of authority by the Secretary of Agriculture to the Under Secretary for Natural Resources and Environment, the delegation of authority by the Under Secretary for Natural Resources and Environment to the Chief, Forest Service, 7 CFR 2.60, the delegation of authority by the Chief, Forest Service, 47 F.R. 36465,






