

TRAVERSE STATEMENT: A closed field traverse for the parcel shown was made with a Sokkia Set-3100 total station and related measuring equipment, all of which met State standards of WAC 332-130 at the time of this survey.

SURVEY NARRATIVE: The original parcel description to Cape Horn Grange gave an East—West distance of 104 feet 9 inches and added a 20' x 170' strip adjacent to the East, along with a 15—foot access easement "to be located" to Eckley (now Woodard Creek) Road. A 1955 document called the distance 104.9 feet and added an additional 215.1 feet to the West. Wayne White, Skamania Store owner, indicates there were traces of a steep wagon road on the East 20 ft. strip at one time. The bottom portion of that strip has been excavated by the adjacent
