COMPLETE LEGAL DESCRIPTIONS FOR 5-K ORCHARDS PARCELS ARE FOUND IN THE BOUNDARY LINE ADJUSTMENT DEED RECORDED IN AUDITORS FILE NUMBER 2006162232 AND SUPERIOR COURT JUDGEMENTS 86-2-00038-2 AND 87-9-00122-6 WHICH ARE BINDING BETWEEN 5-K ORCHARDS AND CAMPBELL PROPERTIES AND HAVE BEEN LOCATED BY THIS SURVEY.

Control was established for this survey using an Ashtech 66-24 Surveyor GPS+GLONASS Surveying System, which met the U.S. Department of Defenseaccuracy standards of the time. RTK mode was used rendering results of .lcm with a 99.9% confidence level also, point to point traverses were made between GPS control monuments with a five-second total station and related measuring equipment, of which meet state standards (WAC 332-130-090,-100) at the time of this survey. The purpose of this survey was to locate the eight tax parcels owned by S-K Orchards. The deeds for these parcels were prepared previous to a complete survey of Section 19 and were described to section subdivision lines or existing features. As a result the areas shown on this survey more accurately represent the areas as laid out on the ground than shown on the legal descriptions.

The North Quarter Corner of Section 19 (also being the south Quarter Corner of Section 18) was identified as an 1.25" iron pipe by Terra Surveying in two surveys (Ref.7\$4) as well as land corner record (AFNIOI746) in 1966. D2AB also identified the same iron pipe as the guarter corner, and placed an aluminum cap stating so (Ref.12). In course of surveying the S-K Orchard's parcels, the land owner to the north, SDS company provided an unrecorded purpose of a boundary line adjustment between SDS Company provided an unrecorded (previous owners of S-K Orchards). The legal descriptions of the Parcels found in BOOK 85, PAGE 213, PARCEL 5 of the S-K Orchards deed descriptions of the parcels found in BOOK 85, PAGE 213, PARCEL 5 of the S-K Orchards deed described pipes set at calls around said tract. These calls matched the unrecorded survey. Field ties to said pipes, demonstrating that the iron pipe used by Terra Surveying and D2AB was not, in fact, a perpetuation of the North Quarter corner, however we did not except this as the true corner for it was stubbed north 2640". The pipe found in this location was determined to only hold for the deed not the section line, due to it not being a proportion between the two northern section corners. A search of the location found no evidence of the original corner, due to much the north half of the section to move south of it's location from previous surveys as well as the north half of the center section line.

This survey held the existing center section corner as monumented by an iron pipe with a cap placed by Terry Trantow (Ref.3) next to the long held Skamania County Brass Cap. The Brass cap was severely bent. This monument is not the true center of section, however, due to it's long standing support and that many believe it was set for the Reference I Seely's Subdivision, this survey has accepted it as a controlling monument.

This survey intended to hold the Reference 7 survey by Terra but as a result of discovering the error made in holding the iron pipe as the north quarter corner, there are some significant differences. The first and most obvious change is the north section line moving south. This has affected the placement of the south line of Tax Lot 306 which was located by Terra in Ref.7 survey. He interpreted that line as being parallel to the north section line, as this survey has also. However, the section line is now a different bearing and thus the line is south of Terra's. Terra also held a call to a bearing tree which was found in a the deed recorded in Book35, Page 342, However, the same deed calls the line as the "south line of the J.A. Homes Tract" which is recoded in Book M, Page, 240, deed which does not call out the bearing tree but holds the 834' from the section corner. This survey holds the distance call. Terra has a note on his plat that the said south line followed closely a blazed line. This survey found blazed "line trees" within one foot of the held line.

This survey held the Olson West Quarter corner monumneted by an Iron pipe. Terra comments on the Ref.T plat that this corner may be more accurately positioned on the ground. No monument was found and no LCR was filled.

This survey used Reference 3 survey by Trantow to calculate the South Quarter corner of section 19. The Trantow survey shows found pipes at the NW corners of lots 5, 6, 8 and 11 of the Ref.1 Seely's Subdivision. After speaking to Trantow, it was his opinion that these monuments had been set as corners for the Seely's Subdivision because they match the monument at the accepted Center of Section. Based on this information this survey held those original monuments as well as Trantow's monuments set by said survey and proportioned the remaining corners as of Seely's Subdivision shown on this plat.

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
