Case Summary:

On 9-8-2007 at 1630 hours I was on patrol near milepost 2 on the DNR 2000 road, the area is commonly known as naked falls. Deputy Arnett and I observed a group of males sitting at the river. One of the males appeared to be consuming alcohol. I contacted the male that was drinking alcohol. He tried to hide the fact that he had been drinking. The male then pulled away from me twice, resisting arrest. As the subject tried to flee Deputy Arnett utilized his Taser to subdue the subject.

Narrative:

On September 8, 2007 at 1630 hours I was on patrol near milepost 2 on the DNR 2000 road. There were several cars parked in the parking area near the location commonly know as Naked Falls. Deputy Arnett and I stepped out of our patrol vehicle to check on activity on the river. We were in the area to enforce the Dougan Falls Safety Corridor and Skamania County Ordinances stating that there was no alcohol allowed in the area. The area is well posted along the Washougal River Road and Dougan Falls stating the prohibited activities in the safety corridor.

Deputy Arnett was looking down toward the river with binoculars. I was standing at the road edge when I observed four males sitting on the rocks near the river. I told deputy Arnett it appeared one of the subjects was drinking a beer. He looked with his binoculars and agreed with what I had seen. He also stated it appeared the males were minors. I began to walk down the steep embankment towards the river. I continued to watch the subjects. As I got to the river and stepped out of the trees I observed the suspect male, later identified as Chazmon Warnes attempt to hide a bottle off to his left side.

I approached the group of four males to see how many of them had been drinking. I also wanted to obtain identification to verify the ages of the subjects. I could not tell if they where twenty-one or not. The group was still seated on the rocks. As I got to within talking distance of the group I openly asked the group if any of them had been drinking. Mr. Warnes looked away and the others looked at each other. I then asked again if they had been drinking. I was looking directly at Mr.

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Warnes when I asked the question. He said he had not been drinking. He began to quickly look around the area and was quickly moving his hands. He continued to look to his left side. I took out my handcuffs with my left hand, then reached over with my right hand to grab Mr. Warnes' right arm. As I did this he stated "O.K. I was drinking" then jumped up. At that time I lost control of his right arm. I told Mr. Warnes to place his hands behind his back as I again reached for his right hand. At this point I heard what I believed was deputy Arnett removing his Taser from its holster. Deputy Arnett told Mr. Warnes to calm down or he would be Tased. I again reached for Mr. Warnes hand. My back was to Deputy Arnett but I could notice the red dot from the laser of his Taser pointed at the back of Mr. Warnes. I again reached down and grabbed Mr. Warnes arm near his hand. When I did that he quickly pulled away. As he pulled away I was trying to follow his right arm, this exposed my right side. Due to the uneven ground and rocky surface this left me vulnerable for an attack. Once I no longer had any physical control of Mr. Warnes I said "Tase him". I then turned back toward the subject to see if he was still next to me. The subject appeared to be fleeing. I began to run back towards the way I had approached the group. After a few steps I heard the Taser discharge and noticed the subject fall on the rocks about fifteen feet down river. He had apparently jumped from the rock area where they where sitting, across a five to six foot gap in the rocks where there was water running between. I immediately went around to the subject. As I did I called my dispatch center to advise them the Taser had been deployed and I requested medical assistance for Mr. Warnes.

As I approached Mr. Warnes I noticed he was in obvious pain. He was lying face down on the rocks. I noticed blood coming from the area of his head. I went over to Mr. Warnes and advised him we had medics on the way to check him out. Once I was sure that he did not have anything in his hands. I used a couple of t-shirts on his head to slow the bleeding. After two to three minutes the bleeding appeared to slow. I kept the shirts on his head. Mr Warnes was apologetic but said, "I can't get in trouble". I asked him why, he then stated he had just got out of a Juvenile Detention Facility. I went up to the patrol car to obtain a first aid kit. When I returned Mr. Warnes was lying back on the rocks. Deputy Arnett had removed the Taser probes from Mr. Warnes back. I applied alcohol to the area and placed bandages over the puncture areas. I also tended to several cuts on his feet. He still had the shirt on his head. I checked his head several times to make sure he was not bleeding again. The bleeding had stopped and the blood was drying on his face. Several times throughout the medical treatment of Mr. Warnes he asked us to help him out and please not call his parole officer or make a report on the incident. Where Mr. Warnes had been seated there was a 40oz bottle of beer (Old English 800) the bottle was half empty. Mr Warnes stated he had several swigs from the bottle. His friends did not appear to be drinking.

Deputy Mckay arrived. Medics also arrived shortly after and treated Mr. Warnes for his injuries. He has transported to Legacy Salmon Creek for an evaluation.

Proposed Re-Training Plan

October 1, 2007

In response to the incident at Naked Falls on 09/08/07, this re-training plan will seek to address identified areas relevant to this incident that will help Reserve Deputies Tony Warren and Lyle Arnett to refine their skills and improve their performance. The proposed training and/or counseling shall consist of:

- 1. Additional training in environmental considerations when utilizing the Taser.
- 2. Additional training in defensive tactics regarding "Control before cuffing" and proper methods for gaining control of subjects for arrest. This aspect should be addressed in the next defensive tactics training scheduled in November. Depending on performance in that training, additional one-on-one training may be necessary.
- 3. Additional time riding with full-time deputies to gain exposure to a wider variety of situations where judgment and consideration of the totality of the circumstances will be utilized.

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7.2.3 Electronic Devices

<u>Taser:</u> An electro-muscular disruption device that disrupts the body's ability to communicate messages from the brain to the muscles, causing temporary motor skills dysfunction to a subject.

It is the policy of the Sheriff of Skamania County to authorize the use of the Taser as a use of force option. The Taser falls into the same level as that of Chemical Agents.

The Taser may be used when a subject is displaying active, aggressive or aggravated aggressive resistance to an Officer/Deputy attempting to conduct legal enforcement activities.

Training and Certification:

A certified Taser instructor will be the only authorized person(s) to instruct on the use of the Taser. Deputies authorized to use a Taser must successfully complete an initial certification-training course, to include written and practical tests. Once certified, Deputies must attend annual recertification.

Equipment Care and Handling:

The Taser will be inspected for damage and cleanliness, and batteries and cartridges replaced when required, by the Deputy. The battery display will be checked on the CID at the beginning of each shift. A spark test will be conducted once a shift cycle and annotated in the Deputies log book (a use of force report is not required for a spark test). A battery reading of 20% or less will require the DPM/battery pack be changed. The DPM/battery pack will NOT be removed from the Taser except when the reading is at or below 20% or to conduct a data download (to be completed by a supervisor). The Taser will never be stored more than 48 hours without the DPM/battery pack attached. Tasers must be stored and secured in a climate-controlled area, not in a vehicle.

Uniformed Deputies will carry the Taser in an approved issued holster. The holster will be carried on the duty belt, on the opposite side of the duty firearm, cross draw position is optional.

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The on-duty supervisor will be notified and a use of force report will be completed if the Taser is deployed. The report will be reviewed by the onduty supervisor to ensure it was utilized in accordance with the office use of force policy.

Present the Taser to a supervisor for data download prior to the end of the shift if a reported use of force incident occurs.

Probe Removal:

EMS personnel will be requested to respond to remove the probes from the subject in which it was deployed. If EMS is not available, the probes can be removed by the Deputy. The site of the probes entry will be cleaned with provided antiseptic wipes, and then covered with provided bandage. Ensure the effected area is photographed prior to bandaging, if possible.

If the probes are deployed in a sensitive area such as the head, neck, or genitalia or if the Deputy feels it is beyond his capability to remove the probes, summon EMS immediately.

Probes removed from a persons skin will be treated as a biohazard. The used/spent cartridge will be placed in evidence/property.

Due to the uneven ground and rocky surface this left me vulnerable for an attack. Once I no longer had any physical control of Mr. Warnes I said "Tase him". I then turned back toward the subject to see if he was still next to me. The subject appeared to be fleeing. I began to run back towards the way I had approached the group. After a few steps I heard the Taser discharge and noticed the subject fall on the rocks about fifteen feet down river. He had apparently jumped from the rock area where they where sitting, across a five to six foot gap in the rocks where there was water running between. I immediately went around to the subject. As I did I called my dispatch center to advise them the Taser had been deployed and I requested medical assistance for Mr. Warnes.

As I approached Mr. Warnes I noticed he was in obvious pain. He was lying face down on the rocks. I noticed blood coming from the area of his head. I went over to Mr. Warnes and advised him we had medics on the way to check him out. Once I was sure that he did not have anything in his hands. Chief Bond,

This investigation began when I was informed Reserve Deputies Arnett and Warren were involved in a use of force incident at Naked Falls, off the DNR 2000 Road at approximately MP 2 on September 8, 2007 at 1630 hours. I received their written reports, use of force forms, and a criminal history of the victim involved, Chazmon WARNES. I reviewed the reports and determined the following facts to be an overview of the incident:

Reserve Deputies Arnett and Warren stopped their patrol vehicle on the DNR 2000 Road at the area commonly known as Naked Falls. They got out and observed the people down on the rocks by the river. Deputy Warren noticed a group of 4 younger looking males on the rocks. He believed he saw an alcohol container by one of the males. He told Reserve Deputy Arnett about his observations. Reserve Arnett used his binoculars to observe the group more closely and observed one of the males holding a 40-ounce bottle of beer in his hands. The two deputies went down to contact the group. As they were approaching, the male with the beer bottle moved the bottle and tried to conceal it from view. The area where this incident occurred is within the Dougan Falls Safety Corridor. All possession of alcohol in this area is prohibited. Any violation is a misdemeanor under Skamania County Ordinance 8.60.030. In addition, Reserve Arnett thought the males appeared to be under the age of 21, which would make possession of alcohol a violation of RCW 66.44.270.2, a misdemeanor.

Deputy Warren asked the group if any of them had been drinking. Three of the group stated they had not been drinking. The subject seen holding the 40-ounce beer bottle, later identified as Chazmon WARNES, did not respond. Deputy Warren said WARNES was "quickly looking around the area and was quickly moving his hands". Deputy Warren pulled out his handcuffs and grabbed WARNES' arm with his free hand. WARNES stated, "O.K. I was drinking", jumped up and pulled away from Deputy

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Warren's grasp. Deputy Arnett was standing behind Deputy Warren and observed the incident. As things escalated, Deputy Arnett drew his Taser, pointed it at WARNES, and told him to calm down or he would be "Tased". Deputy Warren reached for WARNES' arm again and WARNES spun away from his grasp. Deputy Warren believed WARNES "wanted to fight". Deputy Warren told Deputy Arnett to "Tase him". WARNES attempted to jump across a 4-5 foot section of water onto some rocks. Sometime during that jump, Deputy Arnett fired his Taser, with both probes striking WARNES on his back. WARNES fell to the rocks and struck his head, resulting in a laceration to his scalp. Deputies Warren and Arnett told the three remaining males to remain where they were and walked around the water to where WARNES was lying face down on the rocks, bleeding. The deputies requested a towel or shirt from the three boys and applied direct pressure to the laceration. Deputy Warren radioed dispatch and requested medical assistance be sent Code 3.

Deputy Ty McKay responded to the incident. Fire District 4 personnel arrived and provided medical treatment. A Search and Rescue ropes team was utilized to get the stretcher back up the steep trail to the DNR 2000 Road. WARNES was transported from the scene by ambulance.

Telephone interview with Michael Curtis 09/10/07:

On 09/10/07 at approximately 1426, I spoke with Michael Curtis on the phone. His name was given to me by Deputy McKay as an on-scene witness. I advised Curtis the phone call was being recorded and asked him if that was acceptable. He said it was. I asked Curtis to describe the incident at Dougan Falls. Curtis told me he took his 15-year old nephew up to Naked Falls this last weekend. While they were there, he observed a group of kids at the river. Curtis said he saw an alcohol bottle by one of the kids, but did not see him drink from it. Curtis saw two deputies come down the trail and contact the kids. One of the deputies walked up to the kid by the bottle and told him to "stand up. You're under arrest". The deputy reached down to grab the kid. The kid stood up. Curtis said the kid looked scared and tried to run. Curtis heard one deputy yell, "Tase him", then saw the kid jump over a gap in the river. The second deputy Tased the kid in mid-air as he was jumping over the water. The kid went limp and landed on his head and face on the rocks. Curtis said there was blood everywhere. Curtis said he didn't think the officers should have Tased the kid as he had "nowhere to run". Curtis is a Captain in the U.S. Army and is stationed at Fort Hood, Texas. He is currently visiting family in this area.

Telephone interview with Michael Erwin 09/10/07:

On 09/10/07 at approximately 1508, I spoke with Michael Erwin on the phone. Michael was one of the group of 4 younger males at the river with WARNES. I asked Michael to tell me what happened at Naked Falls. Michael said he and WARNES had been jumping off the cliff into the swimming hole at Naked Falls. They got out of the water and sat down with their friends on the rocks. Michael said WARNES got a 40-ounce beer from someone and had taken 2-3 drinks from the bottle. Two deputies walked up and asked the group if they had been drinking alcohol. Michael said the group said, "No", except for WARNES. The deputies walked up to WARNES and told him he was going to jail. One of the deputies tried to grab WARNES' arm, but WARNES pulled away. Michael said he heard the other deputy warn WARNES he would be Tased.

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WARNES got scared and jumped off a "ledge" that was 4-5 feet tall. In midjump, the deputy "shot him with the Taser". Michael could see WARNES' arms straighten behind his back and watched his legs go limp. WARNES landed on the rocks and struck his face. Michael said the deputies told him to, "sit the fuck down or you're going to get Tased too". Michael could see WARNES on the rocks and described his whole face as being covered with blood. The two deputies asked the group for some shirts and held them against WARNES' head to stop the blood. Later, Deputy "Ty" showed up at the same time as the medics. I asked Michael if he knew where the Taser probes struck WARNES. Michael said WARNES had three marks on his back: one on his neck, one between his shoulders, and one on his lower back. I asked Michael if he had seen the signs at the trailhead or along the road indicating the Dougan Falls Safety Corridor. He said he had not.

Telephone interview with Gabriel Erwin on 09/10/07:

After I finished talking with Michael, I asked if his brother Gabriel was home. Michael said he was and gave the phone to Gabriel. He was present at the river with Michael and WARNES. I explained to Gabriel the phone call was being recorded and asked him if that was acceptable. Gabriel said it was fine. I asked Gabriel to describe what happened at Naked Falls. He told me he was at the falls with his brother and two other friends, WARNES, and "Nicko" (Nicholas Foster). Mike and WARNES had just gotten out of the water and sat down. WARNES was given a beer by some guy and took 3-4 drinks from the bottle. Gabriel saw two deputies walk up behind WARNES and one of them grabbed WARNES by the arm. The deputy told WARNES he was going to jail. WARNES pulled away from the deputy and jumped off a rock over the river. In mid-air, one of the deputies "Tased" WARNES. Gabriel said he could see WARNES' arms stiffen up and go straight behind his back. WARNES fell on the rocks and hit his face. One of the officers said, "Sit down mother fucker or you're getting it too". I asked Gabriel if that was what the officer said or if it was Gabriel's words. Gabriel said, "Those were his exact words." Gabriel said one of the deputies also told a lady to "Shut up or going to jail". Gabriel describes the entire event as "unnecessary". Gabriel told me he thought officers could only use Tasers when they were threatened with a gun or a knife.

Recorded statement of Reserve Deputy Lyle Arnett 09/11/07:

On 09/11/07 at approximately 1835, I met with Reserve Deputy Lyle Arnett at the Sheriff's Office. I went through the Skamania County Sheriff's Office Employee Rights and Responsibilities form with Deputy Arnett. He signed that he understood and was willing to have the interview recorded. I explained to Deputy Arnett the purpose of the interview and asked him to tell me what happened at Naked Falls on 09/08/07. Deputy Arnett said he and Deputy Warren were working patrol in the Dougan Falls Safety Corridor. They pulled up at approximately MP 2 on the DNR 2000 Road to look for criminal violations. Deputy Arnett was using some binoculars and spotted a group of four young men down on the rocks. One of the young men had an open 40-ounce bottle of Old English 800 beer and was drinking from it. Deputy Arnett and Deputy Warren decided to go down and make contact with the group, as there is no alcohol allowed in the Dougan Falls area. Deputy Arnett and Deputy Warren decided Deputy Warren would handle the contact, while Deputy Arnett provided cover.

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As they approached the group, Deputy Arnett saw the young man with the beer move the beer out of sight. Both deputies asked the group if anyone had been drinking. The group said they had not. Deputy Warren approached the young man with the beer, later identified as Chazmon WARNES. As Deputy Warren asked WARNES again if he had been drinking, WARNES jumped up. Deputy Arnett described WARNES as being obviously nervous. He could not hear everything Deputy Warren was saying to WARNES, as he was approximately 8-10 feet behind Deputy Warren. Deputy Warren had his set of handcuffs out and attempted to handcuff WARNES. Deputy Arnett said that is how Deputy Warren handles things. He said, "That is Deputy Warren's thing. If there's going to be an issue, he'll get them in handcuffs real quick so there isn't gonna be an issue."

As WARNES pulled away from Deputy Warren, Deputy Arnett drew his Taser and pointed it at WARNES. He advised WARNES to calm down or he was going to Tase him. Deputy Warren walked around behind WARNES and attempted to handcuff him. WARNES pulled away from Deputy Warren and started to run away. Deputy Arnett said he did not fire his Taser during Deputy Warren's contact, as he was afraid he might hit Deputy Warren. Once WARNES pulled away, Deputy Warren said, "Tase him". WARNES ran over to a rock at the edge of small pond of water, approximately 5-6 feet across. Deputy Arnett said he had to run forward to get closer to WARNES. WARNES jumped across the water towards the rocks on the other side. Deputy Arnett fired his Taser while WARNES was jumping across the water, as he was near the end of the jump. Both Taser probes struck WARNES in the back, causing him to fall hard on the rocks on the other side. Deputy Arnett said, "I had the shot. I took it. I hit him. He went down pretty hard. He went down on his side and he didn't move." Deputy Arnett told the other three young men in the group to stay where they were and not to move. Deputy Amett and Deputy Warren ran around the pond of water and used some t-shirts from the group to apply direct pressure to WARNES' lacerated scalp. WARNES kept asking Deputy Arnett if he could help him. Deputy Arnett asked him how he could help him. WARNES told him he just got out of jail and didn't want to go back to jail. He wasn't supposed to be out there drinking. He asked Deputy Amett to not report this to his probation officer. Deputy Arnett said he removed both barbs from WARNES' back; one between his shoulders, and the other near his kidney.

I asked Deputy Arnett where he thought WARNES was going to run. Deputy Arnett said, "Sergeant, it really happened so fast I don't know where he would really be running to, other than away from us to get away." I asked Deputy Arnett what charges WARNES was being arrested for when Deputy Warren went to handcuff him. Deputy Arnett said they already had the Dougan Falls violation, which was a misdemeanor, and they believed MIP, which was another misdemeanor. Deputy Arnett said he and Deputy Warren treat adults and juveniles the same way during initial contacts, and even arrests, until they determine identification and age. Once they know the person is a juvenile, they either call parents for alcohol violations, or cite and release if they are over 18.

I asked Deputy Arnett if he had received Taser training from our agency. He said he had, in January of this year. I asked Deputy Arnett who conducted the training. He stated Deputy Helton provided the training. I asked if Deputy Helton talked about where and when a Taser should be utilized. Deputy Arnett accurately described where the Taser fell within the Use of Force continuum. I asked Deputy Arnett if Deputy Helton talked

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about any environmental considerations when using a Taser, such as locations where you shouldn't use a Taser. Deputy Arnett said he was taught not to use the Taser if someone was standing at the top of some stairs, next to a river, on a cliff, or other such places where the person might fall and get really hurt. I asked Deputy Arnett if he considered the external factors, such as the environment, before he used the Taser. Deputy Arnett said, "Sergeant, to a point I did. When I first drew the Taser on the suspect, I gave him the verbal warning. I figured most times I've given verbal warnings, most people will comply. I didn't expect him to run. Honestly, I just figured he'd be compliant. I knew we were down on the riverbed area with some jagged rocks, but I knew we were several, maybe 20-30, feet away from any rushing water. I did take it into consideration a little bit, but it happened so fast, maybe I didn't calculate the best." I asked Deputy Arnett if he felt he did the right thing at the time, without consideration for everything that has happened since the incident. Deputy Arnett said, "At that time, I honestly thought I was doing the right thing. Obviously I didn't expect Chazmon to actually get hurt in the way he got hurt. I figured it would be a simple Tasing. He'd go down and we'd basically take him into custody."

I asked Deputy Arnett how he would treat a similar situation in the future. He said, "I've thought about that several times. It would probably not be the best area to deploy the Taser. Just for the fear that the jagged rocks, some of them are up kind of high, some are low. The terrain is unstable, the water around us, not that we were real close to it. Probably not the best place to Tase somebody. If I had the chance to do it again, I probably would not take the shot." Deputy Arnett concluded the interview by stating his concern for WARNES following the incident. He said he did what he could for him on scene and even called the hospital later that night to check on his status. He spoke with the doctor and everything seemed to be O.K.

Recorded statement of Reserve Deputy Tony Warren 09/11/07:

On 09/11/07 at approximately 1930, I met with Reserve Deputy Tony Warren at the Sheriff's Office. I went through the Skamania County Sheriff's Office Employee Rights and Responsibilities form with Deputy Warren. He signed that he understood and was willing to have the interview recorded. I explained to Deputy Warren the purpose of the interview and asked him to tell me what happened at Naked Falls on 09/08/07. Deputy Warren told me he and Deputy Arnett were working together in the Dougan Falls Corridor. They stopped at Naked Falls and were looking at the groups of people down on the rocks. Deputy Warren spotted a group of 4 young men sitting on the rocks. He asked Deputy Arnett to look at the group with his binoculars. Deputy Warren said he thought one of the young men was drinking alcohol from a large bottle, like a 40 ounce beer bottle. Deputy Arnett looked through his binoculars and confirmed the young man was drinking a beer.

They went down to contact the group. Deputy Warren said he kept a visual observation of the group as he went down the trail. As soon as the two deputies became visible, the young man, later found to be Chaz WARNES, hid the bottle off to his side. Deputy Warren walked up to the group and asked them how they were doing. They said they were fine. Deputy Warren asked the group if they had anything to drink today. The group said they had not been drinking, all except for WARNES. He was looking around and acting kind of fidgety. Deputy Warren asked WARNES again if he had been drinking

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alcohol that day. WARNES did not verbally respond, but shook his head, indicating he had not been drinking. Deputy Warren told him he had already seen him drinking a beer. WARNES was still acting fidgety and looking around. Deputy Warren walked up to him and said, "Hey, if you want to play games, go ahead and put your hands behind your back. We'll just go straight to jail." WARNES responded by rapidly jumping up, with his back towards Deputy Warren. During this jump, WARNES back pushed against Deputy Warren. Deputy Warren tried to take control of WARNES by grabbing hold of his right arm. He tried to put WARNES' arm behind his back in a handcuffing position. Deputy Warren already had his handcuffs out in one hand before starting this process. While Deputy Warren was doing this, he heard the "plastic on plastic" sound from Deputy Arnett that he thought was the Taser coming out. A moment later, he saw the red laser dot from the Taser on WARNES's shoulder. Deputy Arnett also told WARNES to settle down or he was going to be Tased.

WARNES struggled against Deputy Warren and kept trying to "jump around and pull his arm out" of Deputy Warren's grasp. Deputy Warren lost control of WARNES arm and WARNES pulled away. As Deputy Warren lost the arm, he said, "Tase him" to Deputy Arnett. Deputy Warren lost sight of WARNES as he ran away. Deputy Warren got up and ran around behind Deputy Arnett to cut off Warnes access to the trail. As he went behind Deputy Arnett, he heard the Taser deploy. Deputy Warren said he did not see the Taser fire. He looked around and saw WARNES lying on the rocks. Deputy Warren said he immediately notified dispatch by radio a Taser had been discharged and requested an ambulance. Deputy Warren ran to WARNES and checked him to make sure he did not have any weapons. Deputy Warren and Deputy Arnett both rendered medical assistance to WARNES by using t-shirts from the group to apply direct pressure to the scalp wound.

I asked Deputy Warren about his initial approach to WARNES. I asked him what he thought WARNES was doing when he was looking around, acting furtively. Deputy Warren said he thought WARNES was trying to hide something. There was a towel next to WARNES' side and Deputy Warren didn't know if he was just trying to hide the beer, or if there was a weapon under the towel. I asked Deputy Warren where he grabbed WARNES. Deputy Warren said he grabbed him by his upper arm, indicating the tricep region. As WARNES jumped up, he said, "OK, I was drinking" and pulled away from Deputy Warren. Deputy Warren said he reached for WARNES' right hand to do a "wristy twisty" move to get WARNES handcuffed. I asked Deputy Warren what he was arresting WARNES for. Deputy Warren said, "Right or wrong, anytime I go down and contact people and they want to start acting quirky, or they want to lie, or they have furtive movements, and I know they're in violation of the Dougan Falls Safety Corridor, I place them in handcuffs until the situation gets sorted out, or they go to jail....For my safety and for everyone else's, they get cuffed." I asked Deputy Warren how many times he had done that this summer. He said, "About half a dozen times in the last 2-3 weeks." Deputy Warren said he is more apt to handcuff the person if there are more than one or two people being contacted. I asked Deputy Warren what charge he was arresting WARNES for. Deputy Warren said he was arresting WARNES for violation of the Dougan Falls ordinance involving alcohol consumption.

I asked Deputy Warren if he received his Taser training with this agency. He said he did in 2005. I asked Deputy Warren if during his Taser training, he was instructed to AFN #2008171712 Page: 97 of 134

evaluate the environment. Deputy Warren said he knows he should not use the Taser on someone who is standing on the top of the building, at the edge of a cliff, or up a tree. I asked him why he should not use the Taser in those circumstances. Deputy Warren said because they will fall and get hurt. I asked Deputy Warren where he thought WARNES was running to when he ran away. Deputy Warren said, "He can run down river, to the road, he can hitch a ride and be gone. In an area like that, with all of the people, he'd have no problems getting out of there." I asked Deputy Warren how the other people on the rocks reacted to this incident. Deputy Warren said the group with WARNES was cooperative and not any problem. Later, when they had a chance to talk to WARNES' friends, they asked why WARNES ran away. The group said, "That's just the way he is. He's like that." Another group of about 5 people approached and asked what was going on, but they never got any closer than 35-50 yards away. Deputy Arnett told the lady in the group that if she wasn't part of it, she should just stay away. The lady and the group stayed away.

I asked Deputy Warren if there was anything else he wanted to add. Deputy Warren said when he was giving medical attention to WARNES, he kept asking Deputy Warren not to report this incident to his probation officer because he just got out of juvenile detention and was not supposed to be drinking.

Applicable Policies:

<u>Section 4.2:</u> All employees must: refrain from profanity and respect other employees' rights – be courteous and polite. We recognize that in extreme situations profanity can be part of an escalation of force, and as such, its careful use can be allowed in certain circumstances.

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<u>Section 5.6:</u> Use of Force: You may use only the minimum amount of force necessary to affect the desired lawful objective. These are the steps in a carefully orchestrated escalation of force: Presence, Verbal, Escort Compliance, Chemical Sprays/Taser, Pain Compliance, Impact Weapons, Deadly Force. Conditions may justify your entering this escalation at any level.

Section 5.8: Community Relations: Deputies act in public, under circumstance that could cause misunderstanding and/or misinterpretation of law enforcement activities. Witnesses and participants are influenced by their preconceptions and biases when they evaluate police action. This can lead to incidents that cause resentment of all police action, no matter how legitimate. If the public understands and appreciates the nature of the police task, they can better judge whether deputies are serving the community. As part of the process of the deputy/public communication, the public needs information about the nature of the deputy role in order to develop an understanding. Public acceptance of activities that are an essential part of routine deputy duties will then be understood.

Section 7.2.3: Electronic Devices: It is the policy of the Sheriff of Skamania County to authorize the use of the Taser as a use of force option. The Taser falls into the same level as that of Chemical Agents.

Conclusions

Based on the above information and investigation of this incident, I believe Reserve Deputies Lyle Arnett and Tony Warren acted within office' policy and procedures. They utilized the Taser after employing all of the preliminary use of force options, including presence, verbal, and escort compliance. Their use of profanity can be justified as "An escalation of force, and as such, its careful use can be allowed in certain circumstances." The deputies were working in a remote location, under stressful circumstances, trying to maintain control of a group of suspected violators while at the same time dealing with the injured person and inquisitive bystanders.

While I do not find there were any direct policy violations, I do believe the two reserve deputies failed to adequately assess the situation and their environment prior to utilizing the Taser to subdue a fleeing misdemeanor violator. As part of their training, they are taught to consider not only their surroundings, but also the possibility of injury to the subject if the Taser is deployed. The Taser is an "electro-muscular disruption device that disrupts the body's ability to communicate messages from the brain to the muscles, causing temporary motor skills dysfunction to a subject (Section 7.2.3). In this case, the subject appeared to be jumping through the air, over a body of water, onto an uneven rock surface. By disrupting his motor skill functions during this process, the likelihood of injury to the subject should have been predicted.

I would recommend counseling for both reserves, additional training in environmental considerations when utilizing the Taser, and more experience riding with other deputies. In addition, I would like to see Deputy Warren receive additional training in how to properly control a subject prior to attempting handcuffing.

give name and rank upon request of a citizen or another member of the Department except while on an approved Special Assignment.

refrain from excessive use of alcohol while off duty and in public view.

avoid debts which could compromise your integrity. refrain from profanity and respect other employees' rights - be courteous and polite. We recognize that in extreme situations profanity can be part of an escalation of force, and as such, its careful use can be allowed in certain circumstances.

refrain from speech that suggests racism, sexism, or intolerance about any group. This includes jokes, even in the private areas of the Office.

SKAMANIA COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE RESERVE DEPUTY POLICY

10.2.001 PURPOSE:

To establish guidelines for conduct and duties of Reserve Deputies, and to establish guidelines for their use by the Office.

10.2.010 **CONDUCT:**

Conduct of Reserve Deputies of this Officet shall be governed by the policies and procedures set forth in the <u>Policy and Procedures</u> manual of the Skamania County Sheriff's Office for regular service employees.

10.2.020 **APPEARANCE**:

All Reserve Deputies shall follow the same Uniform and Grooming standards as a regular deputy.

10.2.030 QUALIFICATIONS:

Candidates for Reserve Deputies shall submit a written application for employment, designed by the Department.

Candidates shall be subject to a thorough and complete background investigation.

Candidates shall undergo a polygraph examination.

Candidates shall have an oral interview with the Sheriff and other Office members that the Sheriff deems necessary.

Candidates must be 21 years of age, and a resident of Skamania County. Exceptions to this rule is at the discretion of the Sheriff.

Candidates shall take a written entry examination.

Candidates shall have a valid driver's license, with a 'clean' driving record.

Candidates shall have no history of any illicit drug use, no marihuana use in the last three years, or abuse of prescription drugs or alcohol.

Candidates will have a High School Diploma or GED.

10.2.040 **TRAINING**:

Candidates for Reserve Deputy, having passed all entry tests, <u>shall</u> undertake a minimum of 211 hours of Law Enforcement training. 170 hours shall be from a Washington State Accredited Reserve Academy.

Equivalent training from other Law Enforcement Academies will be submitted to the Washington State Criminal Justice Training Commission to be reviewed for possible Reserve Certification.

Training shall be done on the Candidate's own time, and at the Candidate's own expense. Class tuition paid by Office.

After completion the initial training, each Reserve shall complete a minimum of 16 hours of training in the Dispatch and Jail functions. This can be accomplished by working two eight hour shifts in the Dispatch and Jail area.

Each Reserve shall also complete 25 hours of training in the Policy and Procedures of the Skamania County Sheriff's Office, operation of Radio and Emergency Equipment in Skamania County Patrol Vehicles, and report writing.

Each Reserve Deputy shall receive a minimum of four hours training in the use of Electronic Speed Monitoring Devices before they may use this equipment.

Each Reserve Deputy shall attend inservice training classes as scheduled by the Reserve Coordinator, or attend other Law Enforcement training that is considered equivalent. A minimum of 40 hours per year continuing education will be required.

Each Reserve Deputy shall qualify with their Service Weapon twice per year on a course prescribed by the Office Firearms Training Officer.

10.2.045 **PROBATION**:

Prior to being issued a uniform, each Reserve Deputy will work with a Regular Deputy for a minimum of 40 hours. At the end of this time, the Reserve's performance shall be evaluated by the Reserve Liaison Deputies. The evaluation shall be reviewed by the Sheriff's Office Administrators.

After completing 80 hours of ride-along hours with a Regular Deputy, a Reserve <u>may</u>, upon evaluation, be eligible to work a two Reserve Deputy unit.

Evaluation to be performed by the Reserve Liaison Deputies, and the evaluation shall be reviewer by the Sheriff's Office Administrators.

10.2.50 DUTIES:

The Reserve Deputy shall accompany Regular Deputies on patrol. They shall be subject to the direction of the Regular Deputy. However, the Reserve Deputy will be able to take enforcement action, investigate minor crimes, and write reports.

The Reserve Deputy shall work a minimum of 204 hours per year, which is an average of 17 hours per month, with a Regular Deputy.

On special details such as:

- A) Parades
- B) High School Ball Games
- C) Fairground Events
- D) Prisoner Transports, Prisoner Security, Outside the jail complex (ie, hospitals)
- E) Crime Scene Security
- F) Emphasis Patrols
- G) Shift Coverage, due to vacation/illness
- H) Search and Rescue assistance, such as road patrol, Base Camp Operations as designated by the on scene coordinator
- I) Vacation House Checks
- J) Courtroom Security

On some details this would be one or two Reserves working together for these events, functioning as a Regular unit handling calls, or other matters related to their specific detail.

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7.2.3 Electronic Devices

<u>Taser:</u> An electro-muscular disruption device that disrupts the body's ability to communicate messages from the brain to the muscles, causing temporary motor skills dysfunction to a subject.

It is the policy of the Sheriff of Skamania County to authorize the use of the Taser as a use of force option. The Taser falls into the same level as that of Chemical Agents.

The Taser may be used when a subject is displaying active, aggressive or aggravated aggressive resistance to an Officer/Deputy attempting to conduct legal enforcement activities.

Training and Certification:

A certified Taser instructor will be the only authorized person(s) to instruct on the use of the Taser. Deputies authorized to use a Taser must successfully complete an initial certification-training course, to include written and practical tests. Once certified, Deputies must attend annual recertification.

Equipment Care and Handling:

The Taser will be inspected for damage and cleanliness, and batteries and cartridges replaced when required, by the Deputy. The battery display will be checked on the CID at the beginning of each shift. A spark test will be conducted once a shift cycle and annotated in the Deputies log book (a use of force report is not required for a spark test). A battery reading of 20% or less will require the DPM/battery pack be changed. The DPM/battery pack will NOT be removed from the Taser except when the reading is at or below 20% or to conduct a data download (to be completed by a supervisor). The Taser will never be stored more than 48 hours without the DPM/battery pack attached. Tasers must be stored and secured in a climate-controlled area, not in a vehicle.

Uniformed Deputies will carry the Taser in an approved issued holster. The holster will be carried on the duty belt, on the opposite side of the duty firearm, cross draw position is optional.

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The on-duty supervisor will be notified and a use of force report will be completed if the Taser is deployed. The report will be reviewed by the onduty supervisor to ensure it was utilized in accordance with the office use of force policy.

Present the Taser to a supervisor for data download prior to the end of the shift if a reported use of force incident occurs.

Probe Removal:

EMS personnel will be requested to respond to remove the probes from the subject in which it was deployed. If EMS is not available, the probes can be removed by the Deputy. The site of the probes entry will be cleaned with provided antiseptic wipes, and then covered with provided bandage. Ensure the effected area is photographed prior to bandaging, if possible.

If the probes are deployed in a sensitive area such as the head, neck, or genitalia or if the Deputy feels it is beyond his capability to remove the probes, summon EMS immediately.

Probes removed from a persons skin will be treated as a biohazard. The used/spent cartridge will be placed in evidence/property.

5.6 USE OF FORCE

1.2-A

You may use only the minimum amount of force necessary to affect the desired lawful objective.

These are the steps in a carefully orchestrated escalation of force.

Presence

Verbal

Escort Compliance

Chemical sprays / Tasef

Pain Compliance (counter-joint and hair holds)

Impact Weapons

Deadly force

Conditions may justify your entering this escalation at any level.

You must promptly submit a written report on any use of force from Chemical Spray upward.

You must impound a vehicle at an arrest/accident scene when the driver is arrested or incapacitated AND the vehicle is not legally parked AND there is no other legal or acceptable driver present. If the vehicle is legally parked, the driver must sign a Hold Harmless Agreement.

Inventory the contents of the vehicle and note if you removed any contents.

Not Incident to Arrest

You may impound a vehicle that is obstructing traffic. A driver may request a tow from a particular company, or you may ask dispatch to send you one from the list. We use the ACCESS/WACIC impound vehicle computer file to track impounded vehicles. Entries and modifications will be made by dispatchers before they go off shift.

5.8 MISCELLANEOUS PATROL DUTIES

COMMUNITY RELATIONS

Deputies act in public, under circumstances that could cause misunderstanding and/or misinterpretation of law enforcement activities. Witnesses and participants are influenced by their preconceptions and biases when they evaluate police action. This can lead to incidents that cause resentment of all police action, no matter how legitimate. If the public understands and appreciates the nature of the police task, they can better judge whether deputies are serving the community. As part of the process of the deputy/public communication, the public needs information about the nature of the deputy role in order to develop an understanding. Public acceptance of activities that are an essential part of routine deputy duties will then be understood.

5.9 INCIDENT REPORTING

Deputy

The decision about which incidents are officially reported is the responding deputy's.

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ORDINANCE 2005-03

(AN ORDINANCE CREATING CHAPTER 8.60 OF THE SKAMANIA COUNTY CODE THAT CREATES THE DOUGAN FALLS RECREATION SAFETY CORRIDOR AND SETTING REGULATIONS FOR SAID CORRIDOR,

WHEREAS, Dougan Falls Recreation Area of Skamania County receives considerable use from the public; and

WHEREAS, residents live adjacent to the Dougan Falls Recreation Area and are impacted by the use of the area; and

WHEREAS, regulations governing the Recreation Area could improve the safety and enjoyments of users and residents of the Recreation Area; and

WHEREAS, the Skamania County Board of Commissioners, has determined that the safety of the citizens and emergency responders of Skamania County as well as visitors to Skamania County would best be served by the creation of a Dougan Falls Recreation Safety Corridor and adoption of such regulations;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE SKAMANIA COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS THAT:

8.60.010 Creation of Dougan Falls Recreation Safety Corridor. In the interest of public safety and in order to create a safe recreational opportunity, the "Dougan Falls Recreation Safety Corridor" is created.

8.60.020 Boundaries. The boundaries of the Dougan Falls Recreation Safety Corridor includes 1000 feet on either side from the centerline of the Washougal River beginning at Milepost 15.45 on the Washougal River Road continuing north to Milepost 15.75 on the Washougal River Road (Washougal River Fish Hatchery) AND beginning again at the southern end of the Dougan Falls Bridge and extending north by northeast to the area commonly known as the "Three Corner Rock" Trailhead, inclusive of the Washington Department of Natural Resources (DNR) 2000 Road.

8.60.030 Prohibited Activities. Notwithstanding conduct that is already prohibited by local ordinance, rule, or state statute, the following activities are expressly prohibited within this safety corridor:

- 1. Use and/or Possession of Alcoholic Beverages
- 2. Discharge of Firearms
- 3. Use of fireworks
- 4. Any activity including, stopping or standing, from one hour after sunset to one hour before sunrise. (Day Use Only)
- 5. Camping (except within the designated DNR campground)
- 6. Campfires (except in DNR approved fire pits within the DNR campground)

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8.60.040 Fires Allowed. Other fires are permitted within the safety corridor only with a local fire department or DNR permit, upon privately owned property by the property owner, and must comply with all regulations attached thereto.

8.60.050 Penalty. Any violation of this chapter is a misdemeanor and the punishment shall be as provided by Chapter 1.16.020 of the Skamania County Code.

8.60.060 Preservation of Private Property Rights. Nothing in this ordinance shall abridge the rights of a private property landowner in the legitimate use of their property within the safety corridor except as to the discharge of firearms.

8.60.070 Discharge of Firearms by Law Enforcement Officers. Discharge of firearms shall not apply to law enforcement officers in the performance of their official duty.

8.60.80 Severability Clause. If any provision of this regulation or its application to any person or circumstance is declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such declaration shall not affect the validity of the remainder of the regulation or its application.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this ordinance shall be effective on May 15, 2005.

Comments:

Yesterday, Sept. 8, 2007, I was on the Washougal River approximately 1-2 miles upstream from the Duggan Falls at an area that has a small waterfall and several large pools of water. A group of four of us arrived at the watering hole at approximately 3:30 pm. Between the time of 4pm and 4:30pm my group observed two Deputy Sheriff's hovering over a young man (estimate 16-20 years old) who was injured. We were told by some closer to the scene that the Deputies approached a group of young men drinking alcohol and that one of the boys tried to run away. As he took flight the Deputies administered a taser while the young man was jumping over a rock. The young man fell face forward and face planted into the rock was bleeding profusely from the head. Three members of my group went closer to ask how the young man was doing and were promptly told to leave or they would face the same treatment. Deputy Arnette was threatening and extremely aggressive to my friends. I admit that I did no!

t see the interaction between the Deputies and the young men only the aftermath of the injured person. The river terrain is extremely rocky, uneven and difficult to navigate a clear path through. To administer a taser in a situation such as that seems to me to be use of excessive force. To send electric shocks to someone mid-air who's over water and surrounded by boulders is extremely dangerous. It seems to me that there is a time and a place for such force and given the nature of the location that not only was the use of the taser inappropriate it created a larger hazard. I am deeply concerned for the injured young man. To witness his injuries and to be threatened by the Deputies that we would receive similar treatment is even more disturbing. I don't have the name of the other Deputy present. The only name we were given was Deputy Arnette.

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
