PROVISIONS

All conditions and requirements contained in reports of examination or permits previously issued apply to this certificate unless specifically noted below.

This is a non-permanent trust water right assigned by the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation (Reclamation) to the Department of Ecology, Trust Water Rights Program. This is not a conveyance of the right, but merely an assignment of interest in the right. Reclamation maintains ownership of and title to the water right throughout its term in the Trust Water Rights Program. No third party rights are to be created, authorized or derived from this certificate unless expressly provided in writing by Ecology and Reclamation. Water is to be made available subject to terms and conditions of a water service contract between Reclamation and Ecology (Water Service Contract No.11XX101734). The specific terms and conditions of Water Service Contract No.11XX101734 are specifically incorporated herein.

The quantity of water released for instream purposes each month will be determined by a panel of fisheries and water managers from Ecology, Reclamation, tribes, the Columbia River Intertribal Fish Commission (CRITFC), WDFW, NOAA Fisheries, and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. The panel will determine specific releases each year based on the March 1 forecast for April through September runoff at The Dallas Dam with the goal of scheduling releases to maximize fish benefits under the specific conditions in any year. The panel will also consider anticipated river conditions and the status of fish runs and outmigration. Ecology is negotiating an understanding with Reclamation to incorporate the adaptive management strategy for the Preferred Alternatives into river operations. This panel shall be in place and establish the release priorities prior to any releases of water.

Ecology shall rescind this Certificate of Trust Water Right either upon termination of or upon failure to renew Water Service Contract No. 11XX101734.

The right to use of the water aforesaid hereby confirmed is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described, except as provided in RCW 90.03.380, 90.03.390, and 90.44.100.

This certificate of water right is specifically subject to relinquishment for non-use of water as provided in Chapter 90.14 RCW.
