IMPORTANT NOTICE: Washington law (RCW 78.08.081) requires that an affidavit or oath of labor performed must be recorded in the office of the county auditor of the county where such claims are situated *within 30 days after the expiration of the period of time fixed for the performance of annual labor or the making of improvements*. You should obtain Bureau of Land Management (BLM) regulations from your local BLM office to determine any applicable requirements for a mining claim, including payment of annual maintenance fees, maintenance fee waiver qualifications, payment of service charges, and recordation of evidence of annual assessment work and notices of intention to hold a mining claim. Under federal law, you can perform annual assessment work/labor instead of paying annual maintenance fees only if you satisfy the qualifications for a maintenance fee waiver, including filing a certified statement of maintenance fee waiver with the BLM. Additional regulations of the BLM, the Forest Service and the State of Washington may apply to the conducting of mining operations in Washington.
