On June 1, 2016, Steve Storo and Pierre Mathies of our office met with Patricia Ginther and Attorney Gregory J. Miner of Bateman/Seidel, Law Firm in regards to a letter dated April 8, 2016, received from Ms. Ginther, for the above listed claims.

The meeting was held to discuss a survey report from Austin Bell of Bell Design, and to compare the difference between the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) map and National Forest Service map. A review of the documents identified a discrepancy in the legal description of the mining claims due to a change made by the United States Geological Survey in the location and numbering of certain map Sections. In your case what had been described on the map as Section 9 is now legally identified as Section 8. The confusion of the appropriate Section number is further compounded by the U.S. Forest Service maps of the area still using the old numbers.

Where a discrepancy exists between monuments on the ground and description on the location notice, it is a well-established general rule that the position of the monuments on the ground prevail over the description of the claim on the location notice. See TERRY MALEY, MINERAL LAW 55(6th ed. 1996).

We suggest that the most expedient way to solve this problem is for you to amend your mining claim location to reflect the changes to the geographic area of your claims and submit a corrected map. You may amend your location notice to properly describe your claim, without taking in new or withdrawn land and to provide a corrected map. To file an amendment, we suggest that your amendment be written on another location notice. Write "amendment" or "corrected" across the top and complete the information. You might consider including a statement that the amendments purpose is to correct the legal description without changing the stacking of your claims or taking in new ground. An amended location notice relates back to the original location notice date; therefore, use the same date of location on the amendment as you did on the original location notice. An amendment shall not be used to transfer any interest or to add owners (43 CFR 3833.21). You must record the amendment with the county (43 CFR 3833.22).

You may wish to check with the county prior to completing the forms for their requirements. Please include your ORMC serial number on the amendment. File a county recorded copy in this office with a \$10.00 per claim service fee. We strongly recommend any documents you mail us be sent certified.

In your letter you requested that any customary recording fees due both the county and BLM be waived: Our Mining Claim Recordation System/Legacy Rehost 2000, will not accept an amendment without the proper processing fee. In 1979, the BLM developed a program for the automated entry of all actions associated with implementation of the 3830 regulations within the Mining Claim Recordation System. The BLM will not recognize any amendment to your mining claim until you file it properly (43 CFR 3833.22(a). You must pay a processing fee of \$10.00 for each claim or site you amend (43 CFR 3833.22(b).

Lastly, in your letter, you requested that the BLM send a letter to Mr. Brad Sampson, asking him to cease and desist working your mines. The BLM must accept all proper recordings, including those from rival claimants. Disputes over property rights should be resolved by private litigation. W.W. Allstead, 58 IBLA 46, 48 (1981).

Dear Ms. Ginther:

Thank you for your recent email regarding your concerns about your mining claims in the Gifford Pinchot National Forest. First, let me assure you that your claims are in good standing. We show no gaps in payments or required paperwork. The issue is that the description of the location of your claims on your mining claim filing inaccurately describes what is on the ground. To help prevent further over-staking of your claims, you need to amend your mining claim description. This will not change the location of the claims on the ground just the language used to describe it. This is important because your description of where the claims are located have been entered into a database called LR2000. Other miners search the LR2000 database to find areas that are unclaimed and then stake them. The BLM cannot correct the LR2000 database until you amend your mining claim description.

A licensed professional land surveyor will be able to describe the location of the mine with reference to the 1995 Amended Protraction Diagram suitable to amend your mining claim location. For a list of licensed Professional Land Surveyors in your area visit: http://www.dol.wa.gov/business/checkstatus.html. If you have any questions on how to accurately describe your claims, please contact Mary Hartel or Royce Hill, Bureau of Land Management Cadastral Survey, at 503-808-6132.




